

I have a disability / I am dyslexic – can I apply for extra time or special accommodations on the GMAT?

Yes. Test takers with disabilities, including dyslexia, can apply for special test conditions on the GMAT. Accommodations available to test takers with disabilities include: additional time to take the test, additional rest breaks, a sign language interpreter, etc.

If you want to apply for special testing accommodations, you should download the GMAT Information Bulletin and the Supplement for Test Takers for Disabilities from www.mba.com – these documents will explain you how to apply. You must submit your applications early, as decisions regarding special accommodations can take 6 to 8 weeks.
